Quarterly Gathering: Conflict Resolution

This month's meeting was the largest gathering of families we have had so far, **19 in total!** Thank you to all who came out and listened to Patricia Mackie speak on conflict resolution. If you couldn't make the meeting,



here are some highlights from the talk:

1. Remember you are human (we are not God and cannot do everything all the time).

2. Come to the table in cooperation with the Holy Spirit: praying *for* your spouse, praying *with* your spouse, even praying to

God in the midst of your spouse out loud, so they can hear what is on your heart that you might not say otherwise. "God I can't, you can, please do".

- 3. Develop rituals: focus on relationship building and less on problem solving.
- 4. Create a "yes" environment:
 - a. Physical: take care of basic biological urges when they come up
 - b. Neuro system: know yourself and what your triggers are
- 5. Be willing to acknowledge there is a nail in your head: It's Not About The Nail YouTube

Calendar Changes

If you were unable to attend our February meeting we made some calendar changes. Our original schedule was every 3 months or quarterly, including our Family Day.

As a core team, we felt it best to increase our meetings to every other month for a few reasons. We want to make sure that families stay connected and having such a long time between meetings meant we didn't see each other as a large group very often. It also meant that if a family was unable to attend it was almost 6 months before they would see the entire group again at a talk. We felt for both of these reasons every other month was a better cadence for talks.
